INCORPORATING THE GREAT DUKE ALGERDO LITHUANIAN SOCIETY OF TORRINGTON.

Resolved by this Assembly: SECTION 1. That Frederick Voketites, Alexander Bratschnider, Charles Kirszenas, Simon Gelus, Michael Geguzis, George Baercz, Peter Grigalunas, Joseph Paulauckas, Julius Mulonet, Anthony Vokitites, and all such other persons as may from time to time be associated with them, together with their successors, be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic by the name of The Great Duke Algerdo Lithuanian Society of Torrington, for the purpose of rendering mutual aid and assistance to the members of said society and their families, and by that name shall have perpetual succession, and be capable in law to purchase, receive, hold, and convey all kinds of property, both real and personal, requisite or convenient for the purposes of said society; may elect such officers and agents as they shall deem necessary; may make and execute necessary by-laws, rules, and regulations for the proper management of said society and its property, provided said by-laws, rules, and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the laws of this state; and shall have such other powers as belong to a corporation under the laws of this state.

SEC. 2. Any three of the persons named in section one of this resolution may call the first meeting of said corporation, giving at least five days' written notice to the other corporators of the time and place of holding such meeting.

AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE GREENWICH WATER COMPANY.
