SEC. 7. A certified copy of all resolutions providing for disbursements from sinking funds shall be filed with the comptroller by the clerk of said board of sinking fund commissioners.

SEC. 8. If the board of finance of said city shall negotiate a temporary loan or loans for city purposes in anticipation of such taxes as shall have been previously laid and not been collected in the calendar year in which the same fell due, such taxes previously laid and borrowed against, when collected by said city and paid to the treasurer of said sinking funds, shall be used solely for the purposes of paying such loan or loans except to the extent to which such loan or loans shall have been otherwise paid.

SEC. 9. The board of aldermen shall not pass any resolution or vote requiring the expenditure of any money by the city until it shall have received from the board of finance a report as to whether or not there is money available for the purpose, unincumbered. If the board of finance shall report that no money is available for the purpose, such proposed resolution or vote shall be laid upon the table and shall not be passed until the board of finance shall report that there is money available for the purpose, unincumbered.

SEC. 10. During any fiscal year, the board of aldermen shall not appropriate from unappropriated revenue until the last month of the fiscal year and until said board shall have completed and approved the budget for the next fiscal year.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE GREENWICH WATER
COMPANY TO SUPPLY WATER TO THE TOWN
OF RYE, IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK.

The Greenwich Water Company is authorized to supply water for public and domestic use to the inhabitants of the town of Rye and its vicinity, in the state of New York.
