be able to continue to heat the five hospitals it has as customers. They are Seattle General, Harborview, Swedish. Cabrini and Maynard

Hospitals. Easton said he has written officials of the striking union

to suggest that they should lift the embargo against oil for Seattle Steam "purely for the sake of the hospi-

tals."
