In the above there is no estimate for small wa
ter pipes, fire plugs hydrants, meters, etc., for consumers, as these are sometims considered in the
contract for water rents, and are required only in
proportion to the amount of water used. For
these and the possible increase in the size of pipes,
pumps and boilers that may be found necessary,
\$15,000 should be added to the above aggregate
amount, making \$92,560.

The above plan and estimates would have
been presented with the approval of an experienced hydraulic engineer, but for the supposition that the Council would peter to have a voice
in the selection of such expert.

In view of the pressing demand for water
supply, the shortness of the time allowed for
accomplishing the work the present year, and
the fact that the company can proceed no further until arrangements are made with the city
authorities, it is thought advisable to present
varied propositions, so as to meet the views of
council with the least possible delay.

The Company propose, first, to build water
works at their own expense, without the expenditure of a dollar by the city in the construction, for the purpose of furnishing the City of
Atlanta with the quantity of water required,
even to the full amount specified in the foregoing estimates for reservoir if necessary, at a
reasonable price to the consumer, compared
