

SAVANNAH WATER WORKS.

SEALED PROPOSALS will be received by the undersigned until the first day of September, 1881, for the construction of a system of Water Works for the city of Savannah, fulfilling the following requirements:

1. The Water is to be taken from the Savannah River and distributed throughout the city in a clarified state, freed as nearly as may be, from the earthy impurities that exist in it.

2. The Works shall have the capacity sufficient to supply the city with ----- gallons of water in every twenty-four hours, distributed with a head of ----- feet throughout ----- miles of pipe, which pipe is to be furnished with ----- fire hydrants, set and fixed ready for use.

3. Persons making proposals will be required to furnish plans in detail, of the work, together with well authenticated estimates of the cost of operating the same.

4. Such general information as can be given will be furnished on application to the undersigned. Parties making propositions are, however, notified that they must themselves offer all the details of the plan and state them clearly and distinctly.

5. No proposal will be considered without an actual survey by the party (or his agent) proposing.

6. Parties may submit estimates for amount of water power.

7. The power shall have capacity of supplying with water, a population of ----- inhabitants, at the rate of ----- gallons per inhabitants in every 24 hours.

8. The parties will be required to guarantee the successful operation of the works; to renew any broken pipes that may occur within one year after the final completion of said works, and to warrant the machinery for a like period.

The blanks are left to be filled as the judgment of persons offering proposals may determine after making the requisite survey.
