For travelling and other necessary expenses of the Expenses trustees of the Massachusetts Agricultural College, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.

For a maintenance fund for the veterinary laboratory veterinary at the Massachusetts Agricultural College, the sum of one thousand dollars.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage. Approved February 14, 1901.

An Act relative to the board of railroad commissioners. Chap. 54 Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of railroad commissioners is Railroad comhereby authorized to expend a sum not exceeding three expenses. thousand dollars annually in procuring necessary books, maps, statistics and stationery, and in defraying expenses incidental and necessary to the discharge of its duties. A statement of such expenditures shall accompany its annual report.

Section 2. So much of section ten of chapter one hun-Repeal. dred and twelve of the Public Statutes as is inconsistent with this act, and chapter two hundred of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. The provisions of section twelve of chapter P. S. 112, § 12, one hundred and twelve of the Public Statutes shall apply to apply to the expenses authorized by this act.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage. Approved February 14, 1901.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF READING TO MAKE AN AD- Chap. 55 DITIONAL WATER LOAN.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The town of Reading, for the purposes Reading Water Loan. mentioned in section six of chapter four hundred and five of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and subject to the provisions of said act, may issue bonds, notes or scrip, to be denominated on the face thereof, Reading Water Loan, to an amount not exceeding twentyfive thousand dollars in addition to the amounts heretofore authorized by law to be issued by said town for the same purposes.

Section 2. This aet shall take effect upon its passage. Approved February 14, 1901.
