James P. Bartlett, Henry L. Richards, Albert R. Hatch, and their associates, be, and they hereby are, made a body corporate and politic, under the name of the Piscataqua Bath, with all the powers incident to corporations of a similar nature.

SEC. 2. The said corporation may establish upon the Piscataqua river, or elsewhere in Portsmouth, with the consent of the mayor and aldermen thereof, floating or other baths; and may make such rules and regulations for the government of the same, and of said corporation, as may seem expedient; and may hold so much property as may be necessary and convenient for such purposes.

SEC. 3. The place of business of said corporation shall be in Portsmouth, and any three of the grantees named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from its passage, and the General Court may at any time hereafter, alter, amend or repeal the same.

CHAPTER 1756.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Dover Landing Aqueduct Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened,* That the Dover Landing Aqueduct Company be authorized to purchase, hold and possess so much real and personal estate as may be necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect the objects of this act of incorporation, such estate not at any time to exceed in value the sum of six thousand dollars.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
