To the Honorable, the Senate and House of Representatives
of the State of New Hampshire:

Respectfully represent the undersigned
inhabitants of Dover, that heretofore there has been experienced
much inconvenience by the inhabitants of the village in
said town, on account of the want of a sufficient supply
of good and wholesome water;— as a remedy whereof the
undersigned have associated themselves together, for the
purpose of conveying, by means of subterraneous pipes,
water from certain Springs in Somersworth, called "Hussey's
Springs," to the said Village;— and they have already expended
on that object, in the purchase of said Springs & otherwise
more than thirty five hundred dollars. — And they
further represent that they experience great inconvenience, in
the management of the concerns of said association,
for the want of being legally incorporated;— they therefore
pray that they may be incorporated by the name of
The Cochecho Aqueduct Association,
with the powers & privileges usually granted by the Legislature
in similar cases. — Dover May 14, 1832. —
