§ 5. The said supervisor shall account to the board of town auditors of said town for the moneys received and disbursed by him under this act.

§ 6. This act shall take effect immediatel.

Chap. 168.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Auburn Water Works Company," passed April nineteen, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine.

PASSED April 11, 1870; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The second section of the act entitled "An act to incorporate the Auburn Water Works Company," passed April nineteen, eighteen hundred and fifty-nine, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Capital

§ 2. The capital stock of said company shall be fixed by the directors thereof, and may be increased or diminished at such times and in such manner as the board of directors may prescribe, by resolution of such board; but the same shall not be less than fifty thousand dollars nor more than three hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of fifty dollars each.

§ 2. The eighteenth section of said act is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

§ 18. Any person who shall maliciously or willfully injure or destroy any of the works or property of said company, or who shall willfully or maliciously commit any act which shall injuriously affect or tend so to affect the water of said company, or who shall throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, any dead animal or other offensive matter into any race, reservoir, pond, river, brook or stream from which said company shall obtain its supply of water, or who shall drain or empty into, or caused to be drained or emptied into, such race, reservoir, pond, river, brook or stream, any foul or impure water, or who shall cause or permit the washing, sewerage or drainage from any dwelling-house, privy, stable or barn yard, owned or occupied by such person, to flow or empty

into such race, reservoir, pond, river, brook or stream, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine or imprisonment, or both, in the discretion of the court; such fine not to exceed the sum of one hundred dollars, and such imprisonment not to exceed the period of three months.

§ 3. Section twenty-four of said act is hereby amended by striking out the words "limited by this act," and inserting in place thereof the words "to which the said company is or may be limited." Borrowing of money limited.

§ 4. Section twenty-five of said act is hereby amended by striking out the words "as the same shall have been fixed by the directors." Indebtedness limited.

§ 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chap. 169

AN ACT to incorporate the Society for Promoting Life Insurance among Clergymen.

PASSED April 11, 1870.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. James Brown, Horatio Potter, William H. Aspinwall, Isaac Ferris, Howard Potter, William Adams, Anson Phelps Stokes, Morris K. Jesup, John D. Sherwood, Nathan Bishop, E. E. Fancher, all of the city of New York, Rufus Anderson, of Boston, Massachusetts, O. O. Howard, of the city of Washington, District of Columbia, I. W. Weir, of Harrisburgh, Pennsylvania, and John V. Farwell, of Chicago, Illinois, and their successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name of "The Society for promoting Life Insurance among Clergymen," the principal office whereof shall be located in the city of New York. The object of said society is to secure, by and through life insurance companies now existing, or through such as may be hereafter created, the benefits of life insurance to or in behalf of clergymen of all denominations, professors, teachers in colleges, theological schools and other seminaries of learning, and to secretaries and agents of charitable and benevolent institutions; nothing, however, herein contained to Corporators.
