

**BUFFALO WATER WORKS.**—The city of Buffalo, it appears, is to be supplied with water, notwithstanding the city has refused to take stock. Mr. Parish, of St. Lawrence Co., has taken \$125,000 in stock, to be paid for in iron pipe. Batten, Dungan & Co. of Philadelphia, who are to construct the works, take \$200,000. The balance, some \$75,000 has been or is to be taken by the citizens of Buffalo. The water is to be raised from the bed of the Niagara river near Fort Porter, by means of two steam engines and pumps of great power, and of the most approved construction, into a reservoir, or more properly speaking, a series of reservoirs, capable of containing a supply sufficient for the wants of the city for about ten days, to be located on some of the high grounds in the vicinity of Prospect Hill, and from thence distributed through pipes to the different parts of the city.—*Argus.*
