## Chap. 412.

AN ACT to confirm the election and proceedings of the trustees of Friends academy.

Passed May 11, 1874.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The election of John J. Thomas, Edward W. Herendeen, Alexander M. Purdy, Emmot Haines, Thomas H. Burgess, James Wood and Isaac Mekeell as trustees of Friends Academy, an incorporated academic institution, located at Union Springs in the county of Cayuga, is hereby confirmed, and they are declared to have been duly elected the trustees of said academy. All vacancies in their number shall hereafter be filled as provided for in the Revised Statutes relating to academies. Election of trustees confirmed. ed.

§ 2. The proceedings of the said trustees are hereby confirmed and made valid, without prejudice to any legal proceedings already had in regard to the same, should any have been instituted. Their proceedings legalized.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

## Chap. 413.

AN ACT to authorize the trustees of the village of Jamestown to raise by tax upon the village a sum of money, for the purpose of laying water-pipe in certain streets in said village.

Passed May 11, 1874 ; three-fifths being present.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The trustees of the village of Jamestown, in the county of Chautauque, are hereby authorized to raise by tax upon the taxable real and personal property therein, a sum not to exceed five thousand dollars to be expended in laying water-pipe from the main pipe on Main street, along East Second and Chandler streets, and for purchasing necessary hydrants ; provided, however, that the consent of a majority of the tax-payers in said village voting at a special meeting called for that purpose be first obtained. Tax. Objects.

§ 2. The notice for such special meeting shall be published at least four times consecutively in each of the daily newspapers published in said village. Notice of special meeting.

§ 3. The qualifications of voters at such special meeting shall be the same as prescribed in section second of title eight, of chapter three hundred and thirty-four of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-nine. Qualifications of voters.

§ 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
