person giving the said bond, to the satisfaction of the said supervisor or the said town clerk. And the person so appointed shall possess all the powers, and be subject to all the liabilities conferred and imposed by this act upon the said Howe, or by any provision of law upon a town collector of taxes.

§ 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Chap. 3

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to supply the village of Middletown with water for public and private purposes," passed April third, eighteen hundred and sixty-six.

Passed January 17, 1867; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. For the purpose of defraying the cost of supplying the village of Middletown with water, the said village is hereby empowered to issue, in addition to the amount authorized by the act entitled "An act to supply the village of Middletown with water for public and private purposes," passed April third, eighteen hundred and sixty-six, notes, scrip, or certificates of debt to an amount not exceeding the sum of fifty thousand dollars, provided the said notes, scrip or certificates of debt shall be issued by the same authority and in the same manner as provided for in said act.

§ 2. The county court of the county of Orange is hereby invested with all the powers conferred by said act on the supreme court of the second judicial district, and shall be always open for the transaction of any business or the making of any application contemplated by said act.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
