### DECILIATIONS

ESTABLISHING A SCALE OF WATER RENTS FOR TH CITY OF NEW YORK.

ERT O. THOMPSON,

"The said Commissioner of Public Works, shall, from time to time, establish scales of rents for the supplying of Orton water, which rents shall be collected in the manner now previded by law."—Chan. 574. Sec. 5. Session Leave of 1871.

The regular annual rents to be collected by the Department of Public Works shall be as follows, to wit:

Croton Water Rates for Buildings from 16 to 50 feet, all others not specified subject to Special Rates, as established by Ordinance of the Common Council, March, 1851.

The apportionment of the regular rents upon dwelling houses, are on the basis that but one family is to occupy the same, and for each additional family, the sum of one dollar per year shall be charged.

Each flat or suit of rooms for one family shall be charged ten dollars per year where they have hot and cold water stationary wash tubs, bath, and water closet, with the privilege of using meter.

METERS will be placed on all houses where waste of water is found, and they will be charged at rates fixed by the Department for all the water passing through them.

WATER CLOSET RATEX.—For hoppers, of any form, when water is supplied direct from the Croton supply, through any form of the so-called single of onbile valves, hopper cocks, stop cocks, self closing cocks, or any valve or cock of any description attached to the closest, each par year twenty dollars.

For any pan closet, or any of the forms of valve, plunger or other water closet not before mentioned, supplied with water as above described, per year, ten dollars.

For any form of hopper, or water closest, supplied from the ordinary style of cistern filled with ball cock, and overflow pipe that communicates with the pipe to the water closest so that overflow will run into the hopper or water close when hall cock is defective, or from which an unlimite amount of water can be drawn by holding up the handl ner war not, five holding.

For any form of hopper or water cloud, supplied from any or the forms of water-preventing sicters, that are approved by the Regimer of the Croton Aquadust, which are so constructed that not more than three gallons of water can be drawn at each life of the handle, or depression to the wat, if such deserms are provided with an overpips, such overflow pips must not connect with the water close, but the earried like a neight water, as provided by the

#### METER

Under the provisions of metion 72, chapter 333, Laws of 1873 (City Charter), water meters, of the pattern approved in accordance with said section 73 of the charter, shall be hereafter placed on the pipes supplying all stores, weekshops, holds, maxifectories, public collinos, at wharves, ferryhouses, stables, and in all places where water is furnished for business consumption, except private dwellings.

It is provided by section 73, chapter 335, Laws of 1873, that "all expenses of meters, their connections and setting, water rates, and other lawful charges for the supply of Croton water, shall be a lieu upon the premises where such water is supplied, as now provided by law." ""

All manufacturing and other business requiring a large supply of water will be fitted with a meter. Water measured by meter, ten cents per one hundred onbic
