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CHAP. 293.

AN ACT to permit the water commissioners of the city of New-York, to construct their aqueduct through the state prison farm at Mount-Pleasant.

Passed May 11, 1836.

The People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. The water commissioners appointed under the act entitled, "An act to supply the city of New-York with pure and wholesome water," passed May 2, 1834, are hereby authorized and empowered, with the consent of the governor, and subject to his control, to make the necessary excavations, and construct the aqueduct for supplying the said city with water, through the farm appurtenant to the state prison at Mount-Pleasant, in the county of Westchester. Excavation through state farm at Sag-Sing.

§ 2. Such excavation and construction shall not be performed so as to interfere with any of the marble quarries on said farm, or to endanger the safe keeping of any of the convicts in said prison; and it shall be the duty of the inspectors of said prison to see that this provision is carried into effect; and any additional charge or expense which may be incurred to secure prisoners, shall be paid by the corporation of the city of New-York. Restriction.

CHAP. 294.

AN ACT act to amend an act entitled, "An act to incorporate the Oswego cotton manufacturing company," passed March 30th, 1832.

Passed May 11, 1836.

The People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. The capital stock of said corporation may be increased at any time by the assent of two-thirds of the stockholders, to two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, each stockholder being entitled to one vote for each share of stock held by him. Stock may be increased

§ 2. The said corporation shall be permitted to manufacture cotton and woollen goods, or either of them, separately. Cotton and woollen goods.

§ 3. So much of the said act as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, or repugnant thereto, is hereby repealed. Repeal.
