Chap. 422.

AN ACT to revive and amend the charter of the Owego Water Works Company, incorporated under chapter four hundred and fifty-eight, laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "An act to incorporate the Owego Water Works Company," passed April twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight.

PASSED April 27, 1870; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Charter of
1868 revived

SECTION 1. The charter of the Owego Water Works Company, incorporated under and by virtue of an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Owego Water Works Company," passed April twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, is hereby revived, and the first section of said act is amended so as to read as follows:

§ 1. Wheeler H. Bristol, Thomas I. Chatfield, Abraham H. Miller, Thomas C. Platt, Ira A. Post, Frank L. Jones, Frederick O. Cable, John C. Worthington, Henry N. Hubbard, Hiram A. Beebe, George B. Goodrich, Jefferson C. Dwelle, Robert Cameron, and their successors, shall be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic, by the name of "The Owego Water Works Company," to be located in the village of Owego, county of Tioga, State of New York, and by that name shall have succession, and may sue and be sued in any court of this State.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
