Deficiencies in funds to be supplied.

of the city of Ogdensburgh, the sum which they shall deem necessary to be raised to pay the salary of the superintendent of schools, not to exceed seven hundred and fifty dollars, and the said common council shall cause the same to be collected in the same manner as other moneys for the support of the schools in said city, and place the same to the credit of the board of education in the general fund. Whenever the aforementioned assessments are valid, if, for any reason, the collector is unable to collect the full amount of his warrant, the trustees shall supply any deficiency to these two funds, provided for by this section, out of any moneys which may come into the village treasury, and shall deposit the same as above provided.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

## Chap. 364.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to provide for a supply of water in the city of Poughkeepsie and for sewers therein," passed April twelve, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, and to repeal chapter four hundred and seventy-five of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight.

Passed April 27, 1869; three-fifths being present.

*The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section two, chapter three hundred and thirty-three of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Water commissioners.

§ 2. In case a majority of the taxable voters of said city shall vote "for water," then Stephen M. Buckingham, Edward Storm, Edward L. Beadle, Abraham Wright, Edgar M. Van Kleeck and James H. Weeks are hereby appointed water commissioners in and for said city, of whom Stephen N. Buckingham and Edward Storm shall be the first class, to hold their office until the second Tuesday of March, eighteen hundred and sev-

enty; and Edward L. Beadle and Abraham Wright shall be the second class, to hold their office until the second Tuesday of March, eighteen hundred and seventy-one, and Edgar M. Van Kleeck and James H. Weeks shall be the third class, to hold their office until the second Tuesday in March, eighteen hundred and seventy-two. And, upon the expiration of their several terms of office, their places shall be filled by persons duly elected at the annual city election for city officers, held in the city of Poughkeepsie, for the year in which such terms of office shall expire, which election shall be conducted in the following manner, that is to say: Each elector may place upon a separate ballot, the name of one suitable person, who shall be a citizen of the United States, of full age, and a resident of said city of Poughkeepsie, and a freeholder under the words, "for water commissioner," and deposit the same in a separate box, to be provided for that purpose, by the officers who shall preside at such city elections, and a separate poll list shall be kept of the persons voting for such commissioners; and the two persons having the greatest number of votes at such elections shall be declared and deemed to be duly elected; and, at every annual city election thereafter, there shall be elected, in the same manner, two persons as such commissioners. The persons elected shall hold their office for the term of three years, and until others are duly elected in their places. Such commissioners, before entering upon the discharge of the duties of their office, shall take and subscribe the oath of office prescribed by the Constitution, and file the same in the office of the chamberlain of said city.

§ 2. Chapter four hundred and seventy-five of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight is hereby repealed.
