

Mr, Dickinson of the Committee on Penitentiary, to whom was referred the communication of the Rochester Water Works Company, submitted the following report:

To the Board of Supervisors of Monroe County:

The Select Committee, to whom was referred the communication of the Rochester Water Works Company, proposing to contract for supplying the County buildings with pure water, respectfully report:

That they have ascertained by enquiry of the officers of said buildings, and communicated to the Water Works Company, the quantity of water it is estimated would be required for the daily use of such buildings, viz:

For Penitentiary	3000	gallons.
Poor House.....	4000	do
Insane Asylum.....	2500	do
Jail.....	250	do
Court House.....	250	do

And that the Water Works Company propose to supply the several buildings aforesaid, with pure water, at the rate of one cent for each hundred gallons.

Your Committee regard it indispensable to the health and comforts of the inmates thereof, that said buildings should be liberally supplied with pure water, and would recommend that the Board of Supervisors of his County should enter into a contract with said Water Works Company, when the said Company shall have so far completed their works as to be in readiness to furnish such supply.
