Proposition of James Henderson for the sale of his lot situate on North St. Paul street, to the city of Rochester, for the sum of \$8,000; the proposition to remain open for sixty days. Table for the present.

Remonstrance of L. B. Langworthy and others, against the passage of the final ordinance for the construction of a sewer in Elizabeth street. Table.

By Ald. Rogers—Petition of the Rochester City and Brighton Railroad Company, for permission to lay a track upon each side of Lake avenue, from Lyell street to McCracken street or such part of that distance as it may desire, and to make the necessary connection of such tracks with their single track south of the southern termination of such double track, the tracks to be laid with T rail instead of flat, and upon the walk side of the curb stone, all the provisions of the ordinance in relation to Street Railroads, passed June 24th, 1862, and the amendments thereto, to apply to said tracks, and the operation thereon, except as hereby modified.

By Ald. Rogers—Resolved, That the R. C. and B.R.R.Co. be and are hereby granted permission to lay their tracks on Lake avenue in accordance with their petition therefor. Adopted.

By Ald. Pond—Petition of Whitmore, Brady & Co. for permission to erect a wood building upon their lot situate between Fitzhugh street and Plymouth avenue, south of, and fronting on the Erie canal. Referred to Wood Building Committee with power to act.

Ald. Pond presented the following, and moved it be received, filed, published, and referred to the Fire Department Committee to report. Carried.

To the Honorable the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Rochester, N. Y.:

The undersigned respectfully represent that they have, already laid, in good order and condition, and properly connected with hydrants, about eight and one-half (8½) miles of water mains or pipes through the following streets: South avenue, St. Paul, North, Atwater, Main, Clinton, Monroe, Alexander, Chestnut, Elm, James, William, Court, Andrew, Clinton Place, Gibbs, Stillson, Franklin, Chatham, Union, Marshall, St. Joseph, Leopold and Mortimer streets; and have been informed and believe, that for the better protection of the city from loss by fire, during the ensuing winter, and pending the completion of permanent "water works" for the city, it is for the interest of all citizens that the above pipes be filled, and kept kept filled, with water for fire purposes; therefore, the undersigned respectfully propose, and now offer, to contract with the city upon just and equitable terms and conditions, and at reasonable compensation per month, to fill, and keep filled, with water from the Genesee River, by means of pumps and stand pipes, so as to maintain at all times a pressure equivalent to sixty feet head of water.

For the purpose of arriving at a basis for an agreement, the undersigned further re-

spectfully ask such action on the part of your Honorable Body as may be deemed expedient.
