For 200,000 cubic yards of embankment, not paid for, at 30 cents per cubic yard, con-

tract price	\$ 40,000 00
For pipe inspection at foundries, charged in final account	11,840 00
For additional expense from City to the lake, said work being done in the winter months of 1875 and 1876, on account of delay by Water Commissioners in getting right of way	75,000 00
For balance of claim for extra work done in Fall and Winter of 1873, in digging pipe trench for Holly system in the city	50,000 00
For extra expense in digging up wrought iron pipe on conduit line, in the Winter months of 1875-76, made necessary by the breaking of bells, which were made according to plans furnished by the Board of Water Commissioners	30,856 00
For amount deducted from final estimate for work done by the Water Commissioners at Mount Hope reservoir	1,474 18
When this contract was let it was my intention not to make any heavy purchases of pipe at once, but to take the chances of an anticipated fall in the price of iron and to buy only as pipe was actually needed; however, by direction of the Board of Commissioners, I purchased 16,000 tons of pipe, whereas had I been permitted to follow the dictates of my own judgment, I should have only purchased some 3,000 tons; I therefore claim an allowance of \$20 per ton on \$32,000 tons	260,000 00
I claim that the conduit should have been measured so as to allow a slope at the sides of one to one. I believe it customary on all public works, and I know instances where slopes have been allowed as high as one and one-half to one, and in quicksand as high as two to one. I believe the difference between what has been allowed and that claimed as above would be about 200,000 cubic yards, at 25 cents per yard	50,000 00
For deductions by the Water Commissioners for repairing leak on conduit line caused by defective bells made according to plans furnished by said Commissioners and without fault of contractor	7,696 30
For deduction for re-filling trenches on conduit line	11,208 23
I claim that the foregoing is not a proper charge against me, under a resolution of the Board of Commissioners passed April 22d, 1876.		
For deduction of 86,984 lbs. cast iron for sleeves in place of broken bells, at 4½ cts. per pound	3,914 28
The above broken bells were made according to the plans furnished, and was no fault of the contractor.
