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thereof as may not be legally claimed and paid over as aforesaid, shall be paid over into the treasury of this state, to be disposed of in such manner as the legislature may hereafter direct.

4. *And be it further enacted,* That the said commissioners shall file a duplicate of their report as aforesaid, duly acknowledged or proved in the manner required by law for the recording of deeds, in the office of the clerk of the county of Rockland, whose duty it shall be to record the same in the book of conveyances, &c. for said county; and the said commissioners shall also file in the office of the said clerk, the certificate of the said assistant register in chancery, that the amount of such valuation of the said land has been paid to him as a deposit in the said court of chancery, agreeably to this act, and thereupon the United States of America shall be entitled to the before described land; and in the event of any resistance being made to the agent or agents of the said United States in taking possession of the said land, by any person or persons, it is hereby declared and made to be the duty of the sheriff of the said county of Rockland, to put the said agent or agents of the United States into quiet possession of the said premises.

5. *And be it further enacted,* That in the event of the death of any one or more of the said commissioners, or refusal to act, it shall be lawful for the governor of this state to supply any vacancy which may occur as aforesaid, by the appointment of such judicious freeholder or freeholders not interested in the premises as he may think fit and proper, who on such appointment shall be empowered to discharge all the duties of commissioners under and by virtue of this act.

CHAP. 85.

AN ACT for the relief of the Trustees of the Schenectady Water Works.

Passed March 24, 1826.

BE it enacted by the People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly, That the provisions of the seventh section of the act to amend the act, entitled "an act for the assessment and collection of taxes," passed April 20th, 1825, be and the same are hereby extended to the aforesaid company; and that all suits or actions which are now authorised by law to be brought by, or on behalf of the said company, may be commenced and prosecuted in any court having cognizance thereof, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in the original act of incorporation.
