

A Law,

To regulate the Waterford Aqueduct Company.

PASSED JANUARY 6, 1808.

BE it ordained by the trustees of the Waterford Aqueduct Company, That any person who shall take any water from any pentstock or vessel supplied by the Waterford Aqueduct Company, without licence, shall forfeit and pay to the treasurer, for the use of said company, *One Dollar* for each offence.

And be it further ordained, That any person having a licence to use the water of said aqueduct who shall allow any other person, not licenced as aforesaid, to carry away any water from his or her pentstock or vessel supplied as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay to the treasurer, as aforesaid, *One Dollar* for each offence.

And be it further ordained, That any person licenced as aforesaid, who shall not comply with such regulations as shall be made by the trustees of said company, and made known by some one of them, shall forfeit and pay as aforesaid *One Dollar* for each transgression. *Provided nevertheless,* That nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to prevent any person having licence to use water for his family, or store or shop, from taking for their accommodation out of any other pentstock, with the consent of the owner thereof; but a licence for a family shall not entitle any one to water for his store, and vice versa.
