copies in the library, or that may be regarded as of improper character, and apply the proceeds to the purchase of other books; and shall keep the books of the library in good repair, and shall make such arrangements as shall be necessary for their preservation and circulation.

May accept donations, etc.

They shall have power to accept the donation of books or other property to such library, and to receive or hold, for the use of the public, the books of any library that may now or hereafter be granted for that purpose, and to make provision for their preservation and repair.

Librarian, etc.

They shall have power, and it shall be their duty to appoint a librarian, who shall have charge of the library under their direction and control with power to appoint such assistant librarians as the said board may direct, and subject to their approval; and the board shall annually fix the compensation which the said librarian and his assistants shall receive, and which sum shall be raised as provided by subdivision four of section twelve of this act.

Compensation.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAP. 87.

AN ACT authorizing the board of trustees of the village of West Troy to contract for a supply of water for public purposes.

PASSED March 30, 1877; three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Trustees authorized to contract with water-works company for supply of water.

SECTION 1. The board of trustees of the village of West Troy are hereby authorized and empowered to contract with the West Troy Water-works Company, from time to time for terms of not more than four years' duration, for a supply of water for public purposes in said village, at a rate not exceeding seven thousand dollars per annum for eighty-five hydrants, or other public taps and the number of said hydrants or other public taps shall not exceed eighty-five unless such excess shall be authorized by a vote of the taxable inhabitants of said village in the manner provided for in the charter of said village for voting other taxes.

Payment provided for.

§ 2. The said board of trustees are also authorized, and it shall be their duty, after having made a contract as above provided for, to assess the amount required for the fulfillment of the same upon the taxable property of the village, to be collected as are other taxes in said village.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
