A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act to compel the supervisors of the unincorporated district of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, to give security, and for other purposes, approved the twenty-first day of April, 1841.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That

it shall be the duty of the board of managers of the company, entitled "the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at the falls of Nescopeck," to make out a full, true and correct statement of all the receipts and expenditures by them, of or on account of the hydraulic works, so as to exhibit the full costs of said hydraulic works; and they shall deliver the same to the trustees, who shall be hereafter elected, of said hydraulic works; and the said trustees shall thereupon issue certificates of stock, in shares of twenty-five dollars each, equal in amount to the cost of said works, and deliver the said certificates to the persons then entitled to the same; and thereafter the certificates for stock in the two companies shall be kept separate; and hereafter, at the next and all subsequent elections for officers of the said incorporation, entitled "the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the river Susquehanna, at the falls of Nescopeck," each stockholder shall be entitled to vote one vote for each and every share of stock bona fide held by him, her or them, in like manner as the stockholders whose stock is connected with the hydraulic works are entitled to vote for trustees, by virtue of an act of this legislature, approved the 21st day of February, A. D. 1844; and so much of any law as is hereby altered and supplied by this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.
