AN ACT

Relative to the Berwick water company in Columbia county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That*

Commissioners. J. H. Young, F. Neuby, M. W. Jackson and A. B. Wilson, or any three of them, are hereby appointed commissioners, to dispose of two hundred or more shares of new stock in the Berwick water company, as directed by the act incorporating the same, approved January twenty-seventh, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen; and as soon as ten or more persons shall have subscribed forty or more shares, the said commissioners shall proceed as directed in the act aforesaid, to hold an election for five managers of said company: *Provided, That at said election the holders of the stock authorized by this supplement only shall be entitled to vote: And provided further, That the dividends, if any, which may from time to time be declared, shall be paid annually to the holders of the new stock only.*

Regulating election districts.
