An Act

To increase the capital stock of the Lehigh Water Company, in the borough of Easton, Northampton county, and levy and collect water tax.

Authorized to increase capital stock.

Authorized to levy and collect water tax from owners of certain improved real estate.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,

That the Lehigh Water Company, in the borough of Easton, Northampton county, be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to increase the capital stock of said company to a sum not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. That the said, the Lehigh Water Company, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to levy and collect, from the owners of all improved real estate, in the borough of Easton, situate within a distance of eight hundred feet from any fire plug of the said company, excepting such persons as are, or may be, consumers by contract, of the water furnished by said company, a sum equal to one-fifth of one per cent. of the assessed valuation of such real estate, as the same shall appear upon the regular assessment books of said borough; and the said sums, so levied as aforesaid, may be collected by the superintendent of said company, upon the duplicate and warrant of the president of said company, in the same manner, and with the same powers, in all respects, as are exercised in the collection of the borough taxes of said borough.
