**A Supplement**

To an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Crystal Spring Water Company," approved April eleventh, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for the directors of the Crystal Spring Water Company to borrow any sum or sums of money, not exceeding their authorized capital, for the purpose of completing and extending their works, and to issue bonds therefor, with or without coupons, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding eight per centum, and that the stock of said company may be subscribed for, purchased and held by any company proposing to use the water furnished by said company. Directors authorized to borrow money and issue bonds.

SECTION 2. That if any subscriber to the capital stock of said company shall neglect or refuse to pay any instalment for thirty days after the time designated for such payment, in a notice published for two weeks in two newspapers in the borough of Wilkesbarre, the stock of such defaulting subscribers upon which said instalments are due and unpaid, together with the paid-up instalments on the same, may, at the option of the board of directors, be declared forfeited to the company, or put up at auction and sold to the highest bidder, for the benefit of the company: *Provided,* That in case of such forfeiture or sale the company shall have no claim upon such subscriber for any further instalments on said stock. Delinquent subscribers of stock, relative to.

SECTION 3. That the stockholders of said company shall have authority to make and adopt such rules, regulations and by-laws for the management of their business, and the number, duties and government of their officers, as they may deem necessary and expedient; and that all provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, conflicting with this supplement, be and are hereby repealed.
