

CHAPTER XXVIII.

An Act to amend the Corporation Laws of the Town of Liberty, in Smith county, and for other purposes.

SECTION

7. Mayor and Aldermen may transact business in Town Hall.

(Section seven alone relates to Nashville.)

SEC. 7. *Be it enacted*, That so much of an Act incorporating the town of Nashville, or any amendments thereto, as requires elections of Mayor and Aldermen for said town, or any meeting of the members or officers of said corporation to meet at the court-house, be, and the same are hereby repealed. And hereafter it shall be lawful for said elections and all other business of said corporation, to be conducted in the Town Hall of said corporation.

Passed October 18, 1832.

CHAPTER XXIX.

An Act to Authorize the Mayor and Aldermen of Nashville to borrow Money, and for other purposes.

SECTION

1. Authority granted to borrow \$25,000 for extending Water Works.

SECTION

2. Power to protect property of Water Works.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee*, That the Mayor and Aldermen of the town of Nashville be, and they are hereby authorized to borrow a sum of money, not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, for the purpose of further extending the Water Works of said town; and the said Mayor and Aldermen are hereby authorized to make and issue the bonds or scrip of said corporation for the payment of said sum of money.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That the Mayor and Aldermen of said town shall have power and authority to protect from injury by adequate penalties to be imposed by the laws or ordinances of the said Mayor and Aldermen, the pipes, hydrants or fixtures, buildings or improvements, belonging to, or in anywise appertaining to, said Water Works, whether within or without the limits of said corporation.

Passed November 23, 1833.
