3. Nothing in this act is to be construed as an approval of the board of visitors in exceeding the appropriations heretofore made to the military institute; and it is the express intent and purpose of the general assembly that no contract shall be entered into for any work or object contained in this act, unless the same is strictly limited to an amount not exceeding the sums respectively designated for such work or object. 4. This act shall be in force from its passage.

CHAP. 163.—An ACT authorizing the rector and visitors of the university to sell certain lands.

Passed March 15, 1858.

1. Passed April 7, 1858.

Bar of visitors 1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, that to enable the rector and visitors of the university of Virginia to procure a supply of water for the university, they shall have authority to acquire such springs, lands and rights of way as may be necessary, according to the provisions of chapter fifty-six of the Code of Virginia.

2. This act shall be in force from its passage.

CHAP. 165.-An ACT for the support of the Western lunatic asylum. Passed December 22, 1857.

1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, that the sum of twenty-four - in lunatic thousand dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of the treasury of the commonwealth, payable on the order of the directors of the Western lunatic asylum, on account of the annual support fund for said asylum for the current fiscal year.

2. This act shall be in force from its passage.

> CHAP. 166.-An ACT appropriating the sum of ten thousand dollars to procure a supply of water for the Western lunatic asylum.

> > Passed March 19, 1858.

1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, that the sum of ten thouomiation to in humatic sand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, out of any money nitor water. 2.1 in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of procuring a supply of water for the Western lunatic asylum, and that the said sum of money be drawn from the treasury upon the warrant of the auditor of public accounts in favor of the directors of the said Western lunatic asylum; one-half in the present fiscal year, and the other half in the next succeeding fiscal year.

2. Be it further enacted, that the directors of said asylum be and ing the use they are hereby authorized and empowered to contract with the owner of any springs, and land which may be deemed proper for the said supply of water, for the purchase of such springs and land as may be necessary adjacent to the same, not exceeding half an acre, and for such rights of way and other privileges as may be requisite for the purposes contemplated by this act; and in the event that they cannot agree with the proprietors of said springs and land for the purchase of the same and the necessary rights of way and other privileges, the said directors are hereby authorized to proceed, in the mode indicated in sections six to eleven, inclusive, of chapter fifty-six of the Code, to obtain title to the same.
