CHAP. CCVIII.—An act to raise money by lottery for conducting water into, and paving the streets of the town of Lexington, in the county of Rockbridge.

(Passed March 10th, 1832.)

1. *Be it enacted by the general assembly*, That William Wilson, Commissioners of lottery. John Ruff, Charles P. Dorman, William Taylor, Mathew White, John A. Cummings, David E. Moore, Richard Morris and William Stevens, gentlemen, or such of them as choose to act, being a majority, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, whose duty it shall be to raise by way of lottery or lotteries, any sum of money not exceeding twelve thousand dollars, which shall be applied to the purposes of conducting and distributing water in the town of Lexington, in the county of Rockbridge, and paving the streets thereof. Sum to be raised. How applied.

2. *Be it further enacted*, That the commissioners aforesaid shall, in raising and applying the said sum of money, be governed by the same rules and regulations, and all persons in any manner concerned in said lottery or lotteries, subject to the same provisions in every respect, as contained in the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth sections of the act, entitled, "an act to raise money by lottery for paving the streets of the town of Charlottesville, in the county of Albemarle," passed March the thirty-first, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, except that wherever the word "Albemarle" occurs in either of said sections, the word "Rockbridge" shall be substituted; and also, wherever the word "Charlottesville" occurs in the sixth section, the word "Lexington" shall be substituted; and after the word "aforesaid," in the fourth line of the said sixth section, the words "and conduct and distribute water into said town," shall be inserted; and after the word "town," in the nineteenth line of said sixth section, the words "and for conducting and distributing water in said town," shall be inserted. And the said sections, so modified, shall apply to the purposes of this act as fully and effectually as if the same words in said sections contained, were herein repeated. 3. This act shall be in force from the passing thereof.

Commencement.

CHAP. CCIX.—An act to amend the act, entitled, "an act to amend the act, entitled, 'an act to amend an act concerning the town of Lexington.'"

(Passed January 5th, 1832.)

1. *Be it enacted by the general assembly*, That the public road leading from the town of Lexington, in the county of Rockbridge, to Carr's creek, in said county, shall be under the special management of the trustees of said town, and shall be by them kept in repair in the same manner, and under the same penalties in all respects, as they are required to keep in repair other roads leading from said town in a south-western and south-eastern direction, by an act, entitled, "an act to amend the act, entitled, 'an act to amend an act concerning the town of Lexington,'" passed February the twenty-first, eighteen hundred and seventeen. Road from Lexington to Carr's creek under management of trustees of town.

2. This act shall commence and be in force from the passing thereof. Commencement.
