money as they may find necessary, not exceeding one thousand dollars, at an interest not exceeding six per centum per annum, for the purpose of conveying water into said town, from a spring adjacent thereto, the benefit of which they have secured for the use of said town; and that the said trustees be, and they are hereby empow- Power to assess ered to levy and collect a tax annually upon the owners of real property, and other inhabitants of said town, in such manner as they may deem most proper, for the purpose of paying the interest on the money borrowed, and to extinguish the debt so created, as they may find the citizens able to bear such taxation. And the money so trol of trustees. borrowed, the manner of applying it, and mode of conducting water into and through said town, shall be under the control and management of the said trustees.

2. This act shall commence and be in force from the passing Commencement. thereof.

CHAP. 232.—An ACT to amend "an act providing for a supply of water in the town of Lexington, in the county of Rockbridge," passed December 19th, 1832.

(Passed January 2, 1834.)

1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, That it shall be the duty Duty of sheriff to of the sheriff of the county of Rockbridge, in addition to the duties fines, and account required of him in the second section of the act aforesaid, to collect, with trustees. account for, and pay over to said trustees, such sums of money as may be assessed by them upon all such persons and things as they by law are now authorized to assess and tax; and to collect, account for, and pay over to said trustees, all fines and penalties imposed by them in like manner, and under the same liabilities as is prescribed by law for the collection and payment of county levy and poor rates.

2. This act shall be in force from the passing thereof.

CHAP. 233.—An ACT to prescribe the mode of electing trustees for the town of Waynesborough in the county of Augusta, and vesting them with corporate powers.

[Passed February 12, 1834.]

1. Be it enacted by the general assembly, That the town of Town of Waynes-Waynesborough in the county of Augusta, as the same has been rated. heretofore laid off into lots, streets and alleys, and as the same may be hereafter further laid off and extended into lots, streets and alleys, shall be, and the same is hereby made a town corporate, by the name and style of "The Town of Waynesborough;" and by that name and style shall have and exercise the powers hereinafter granted.

2. Be it further enacted, That for the better government and Annual meeting well ordering the affairs of said town, it shall be lawful for the white house keepers and male freeholders and house-keepers thereof, who shall have been resident therein six months next preceding an election, and also of freeholders of land or lots therein, who are non-residents, to meet at some convenient place in said town, on the first Monday in April next, (of which place of meeting at least ten days previous notice shall be given,) and annually thereafter, on the first Monday in April, and then and there nominate and elect by viva voce vote, seven fit Trustees, when and able men, being freeholders or house-keepers and inhabitants "lected. of the said town, to serve as trustees thereof. The persons so elected Oath of trustees. shall, before they enter upon the duties of their office, respectively take an oath, or make solemn affirmation, before some justice of the peace of the county of Augusta, well and truly, faithfully and im-36
