lection being approved by the said court, they shall order their clerk to record the same; and thereupon, the title to so much land of the said public square as shall be designated for the purpose aforesaid, shall be vested in the said corporation, and used only as a site on which to erect and use a market-house.

Citizens exempted from working on public roads.

2. *Be it further enacted*, That hereafter, it shall not be lawful to require the citizens and inhabitants of the town of Warrenton, in the county aforesaid, to work on any public road without the limits thereof; any law, custom or usage, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Commencement.

3. This act shall commence and be in force from and after the passage thereof.

CHAPTER 140.—An act to authorise the President and Common Council of the corporation of Winchester to borrow money for the purpose therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

(Passed January 2d, 1829.)

Corporation of Winchester authorised to borrow money to convey water into the town.

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly*, That the President and Common Council of the corporation of Winchester, in the county of Frederick, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered; to borrow such sum or sums of money as they may find necessary, at an interest not exceeding six per centum per annum, for the purpose of procuring and laying cast iron pipes, for conveying water into the corporation, from a spring adjacent to the corporation, instead of the wooden pipes now used for that purpose. And that the said President and Common Council be, and they are hereby empowered to pledge the funds and property of the said corporation for the payment of the principal and interest of the money so borrowed: *Provided*, That any certificates of stock to be issued by virtue of this act, shall have the seal of the said corporation affixed thereto.

What funds pledged for payment.

Seal of corporation to be affixed to certificates of stock.

And whereas, it being represented to the General Assembly, that doubts exist as to the power of said corporation to borrow money, for removal whereof:

Authorised to borrow money generally.

2. *Be it further enacted*, That it shall and may be lawful, for the said President and Common Council and their successors, at any time hereafter, when they shall deem it to be for the interest of the inhabitants of said corporation, to borrow money for the uses of said corporation, and to pledge the funds and property of said corporation for the payment thereof.

Commencement.

3. This act shall commence and be in force from and after the passing thereof.

CHAPTER 141.—An act providing for the improvement of the Medicinal Springs of the town of Bath, in Morgan county.

(Passed January 22d, 1829.)

Trustees of Bath empowered to raise money by lottery to improve Medicinal Springs.

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly*, That the trustees of the town of Bath, in the county of Morgan, or any five of whom may choose to act, under bond and security entered into either jointly and severally, or severally, as hereinafter provided, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, whose duty it shall be to raise by way of lottery or lotteries, a sum of money not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars, for the purpose of improving and rendering more extensively and effectually useful, the public pro-
