57.—An act, to incorporate certain persons by the name of the Third Bellows Falls Aqueduct Company.

SECTION 1. *It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont,* That William F. Hall, Henry F. Green, Russell Hyde, William Henry, William Conant, James I. Cutler, John Robertson, and Samuel H. Taylor, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are, made a body corporate and politic, by the name of *The Third Bellows Falls Aqueduct Company*; and by that name may sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, may purchase, hold and convey so much personal and real estate, not exceeding four thousand dollars, as may be necessary to carry into effect the object of said association, may have a common seal, and the same alter at pleasure, and enjoy all the privileges incident to a corporation, for the purpose of making, repairing, and enjoying an aqueduct for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of Bellows Falls village, in the town of Rockingham in Windham county, with water.

Powers and privileges of corporation.

Object of grant.

SEC. 2. *It is hereby further enacted,* That the said company, at any legal meeting, shall have power to divide said stock into as many shares as they may deem proper, and establish the mode of transferring the same, either by private sale, or for the payment of taxes; and said corporation shall have power to make any by-laws, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state, for the regulation of their common interest.

Stock may be divided into shares.

By-laws.

SEC. 3. *It is hereby further enacted,* That the shares of said aqueduct shall be taken and considered as personal property, and when any share or shares shall be attached on mesne process, an attested copy of such process, and of the officer's return thereon, shall be by the officer serving the same lodged with the clerk of said corporation, otherwise the attachment shall be

Manner of serving process.

void; and said shares may be sold in the same manner as is provided for the sale of any other personal property, and the officer serving the same shall leave a copy of said execution, with his return thereon endorsed, with the clerk of said corporation, within twelve days next after such sale, and said share or shares so sold shall, to all intents and purposes, be vested in the purchaser.

First meeting.

SEC. 4. *It is hereby further enacted*, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be holden within one year from the passing of this act, at some place in the village of Bellows Falls, notice whereof shall be given by a notification in the newspaper printed at Bellows Falls, at least ten days before the time of meeting, signed by William F. Hall and William Conant, or either of them.

58.—An act, incorporating the Randolph Hydraulic Company.

Persons incorporated.

SECTION 1. *It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont*, That Dudley Chase, William Nutting, Oramel Partridge, Thomas Wilbur, Joseph Blodget, Sewell Keyes, John Granger, Benjamin Griswold, Daniel Parish, Jacob K. Parish, John S. Smith and Joseph Fowler, and their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are, incorporated and constituted a body corporate to all intents and purposes, by the name of *The Randolph Hydraulic Company*; and by that name may sue and be sued, appear, prosecute and defend in all suits and actions—may purchase, hold and convey both real and personal estate, to an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars—may have a common seal, and may have and enjoy all the privileges incident to corporations, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of Randolph centre village with pure running water.

SEC. 2. *It is hereby further enacted*, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be holden at the house of Erastus Frissell, in said Randolph, within three months from the passing of this act;—and that William Nutting, Oramel Partridge, and Thomas Wilbur,
