Section 4. Any person interested in such waters or lands so taken may within ten days of such award appeal therefrom either upon the necessity of taking such waters or lands or the award of damages therefor or both to the county court for the county of Orange and such proceedings shall be had upon such appeal as are provided by law for appeals from the action of selectmen in the taking of lands for highways except that all notices provided to be given to the selectmen shall be given to the board of water commissioners. But if the appeal is from the award of damages only it shall not vacate the award of taking, and such waters and lands so taken shall stand as vested in the village of West Randolph.

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No. 294.—AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11 OF NO. 224 OF THE ACTS OF 1884, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE VILLAGE OF WINDSOR," RELATING TO TRUSTEES AND WATER COMMISSIONERS.

*It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:*

SECTION I. Section 11 of No. 224 of the acts of 1884 is hereby amended so as to read as follows, viz.:

Section 11. The trustees shall have the general care and management of the prudential interests and affairs of said village; shall assess all taxes and make out a rate bill accordingly; shall direct the expenditures of all moneys belonging to said village, except for moneys belonging to the water department of said village; draw all orders upon the treasurer except orders for expenses and disbursements of such water department, and shall generally perform all the duties legally enjoined upon them by said corporation; and shall submit their accounts and vouchers to the auditors at least fourteen days before the annual meeting in each year. Said trustees shall have power to abate taxes laid or assessed by virtue of this act, to remit fines imposed for violations of this act or the by-laws of said corporation, and to discharge offenders from imprisonment for the same; the power of said trustees to abate taxes shall be subject to the same limitation and may be exercised for the same cause, as stated and mentioned in sections three thousand sixty-nine and three thou-

sand seventy of the Vermont Statutes. All powers vested in said trustees may be exercised by a majority of them.

SEC. 2. The board of water commissioners of the village of Windsor is hereby empowered to draw orders on the treasurer thereof for all expenses and disbursements of the water department.

SEC. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect from its passage.

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No. 295.—AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE OF WINOOSKI TO ISSUE BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING ROAD-MAKING APPARATUS, AND FOR BUILDING PERMANENT HIGHWAYS.

*It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:*

SECTION 1. The village of Winooski is hereby authorized to issue bonds to an amount not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, for the purpose of purchasing road-making apparatus, and for building permanent highways within the limits of said village.

SEC. 2. Said village, by a majority vote of the voters present and voting by ballot, in a meeting duly warned and holden for that purpose, may determine what amount of bonds, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of twenty thousand dollars, shall be issued, at what time or times—not exceeding thirty years—and at what place or places the same shall be payable, and the rate of interest thereon—which shall not exceed five per cent. per annum, payable annually or semi-annually and may stipulate in said vote by whom, and in what manner the proceeds of bonds shall be expended. Such bonds may be registered, or have interest coupons attached thereto, and shall be issued in denominations of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than one thousand dollars each.

SEC. 3. Each of said bonds shall be signed by the president and by the treasurer of said village, and shall have the certificate of the clerk of said village that said bond is one of a series authorized by said village, and if interest coupons are attached to said bonds, they shall be signed by the treasurer of said village.
