make such other survey or surveys, and return a plat or plats thereof, as they may think right, until some one be approved by them, which shall be recorded as aforesaid; and after any such plat shall be ordered to be entered of record, such record, or any true copy thereof, attested by the clerk, shall be read as evidence, in any controversy relating to the boundary of any lot, street, or alley, within the said town, in the same manner, and shall have the same effect, as if it were the original.

Copy of record to be evidence.

3. The fourth section of the above recited act, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Fourth section of Act of 1812-13, repealed.

4. *And be it further enacted*, That the county court of Tyler shall be, and they are hereby authorised, whensoever they shall find it necessary, to enlarge by purchase, the lot of public land for the site of their court-house and other public buildings, so that in the whole quantity, it shall not exceed two acres; and the court shall be seised and possessed of the land so purchased, for the same purpose, and in the same manner, that they are by law now seised and possessed of the aforesaid lot of public land.

County court of Tyler authorised to enlarge the lot for the site of their court-house.

5. This act shall be in force from and after the passage thereof.

CHAPTER 102.—An act concerning Charlestown in the county of Jefferson.

[Passed February 17th, 1827.]

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly*, That Richard Williams, David Humphreys, William F. Locke, Joseph T. Dougherty, John Buckmaster and Humphrey Keys, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the death of a majority of the original persons named in the second section of the act, entitled, "an act concerning Charlestown in the county of Jefferson," passed on the fifth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and five, who, in conjunction with the surviving persons, named in the said second section of the aforesaid act, shall have and exercise the same power, and perform the same duties as if they had been specially named in the aforesaid act.

CHAPTER 103.—An act authorising the sale of part of a street in the town of Charlottesville in the county of Albemarle.

[Passed February 15th, 1827.]

1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly*, That the trustees of the town of Charlottesville, be authorised to sell a street in the said town on the west side of the court-house square, and in the rear of the lots fronting that square, with the exception of twelve feet on the west side of the said street, from the corner of Twyman Wayt's lot on the south, to the corner of Henry Price's lot on the north, and appropriate the money arising therefrom to the paving and improving of the alley which will remain after the sale aforesaid; and to hold the balance of money arising from the sale, if any, subject to the control of the said trustees, for the improvements of the streets of the said town.

Trustees authorised to sell a street in town of Charlottesville.

Money how to be appropriated.

2. This act shall commence and be in force from the passing thereof.
