

## **GOT THEMSELVES INTO TROUBLE.**

### **Officers of the American Frost Meter Company Resort to Violence.**

Geo. S. Follansbee, Arthur H. Howland and Charles Duncan, the first two being officers in the American Frost Meter Company, and Duncan a teamster, will appear before Judge Holster in the Roxbury Court on Friday, charged with having committed larceny in taking nine meters, the property of the company, which were under attachment and in the custody of an officer of the law. The property referred to was taken under attachment last January, and despite efforts for a settlement it has remained in custody of the court. On Friday nine meters were taken by the defendants by force, it is alleged, from the premises on Lenox street. Deputy Sheriff Fitzpatrick made a diligent search for the property, and found six of the meters at the Fitchburg Railroad station, already tagged and ready for shipment. The three others are said to have found their way to Norfolk, Va., where they were sent by the defendants. Howland is also charged with an assault upon Butler, the keeper. A branch of the case came up in the fifth session of the Superior Court yesterday, before Judge Hammond, on a motion that the officer specify in detail, on his return in the Hunt case, the goods attached. The Court granted the motion.
